## A Passion Play for Hertford

Dramatic reading Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> March 2013, St Andrews Church 7pm

Would you like to get involved in a community production of a modern Passion Play? Come along to this reading to hear the play and find out if you would like to act, perform music, help backstage, raise funds or help out in any other way to get a production off the ground.

A local playwright Kate Miller is writing a new Passion Play for Hertford based on the final days of Jesus' life. A small planning group consisting of Kate, Alan Stewart (vicar of St Andrew's), Rhys Thomas (artistic director of Hertford Theatre) and Julia Hollet (press and PR manager at Shakespeare's Globe Theatre) have been meeting to discuss the possibility of performing the Hertford Passion over the Easter Weekend in 2014.

Our hope is that this will be a community project, and the scale and feasibility of the production will largely depend upon the volunteer contribution of folk from the local churches and community. We are actively exploring funding options for the play and would invite anyone to contact us who might know of any possible revenue streams available for the project.

In order to raise awareness of the play we will premiere a dramatic reading of Act 1 during Holy Week this Easter at St Andrew's Church (Wednesday 27th March at 7 for 7.30pm). If you are interested in knowing more or getting involved please do come along. We are especially keen to meet anyone who might have experience in costume, lighting, acting, music etc, but the project is open to all, including young people aged 12+. There will be an opportunity to ask questions and in order to begin fundraising, there will also be an opportunity to give financially towards the project.
