I'm sure that you have all noticed that the Hertfordshire Regiment's War Memorial outside the Memorial Chapel has been cleaned and is looking at its best for the Memorial Service to be held in All Saints on Sunday 14th September at 3pm.

Our very grateful thanks go to Hertford Town Council and to the Hertfordshire Regiment Association who provided money towards the cost of this important task and in particular to Pauline Geering who not only gave a very generous donation, but who, by suggesting that it needed cleaning, spurred us into action allowing the job to be done in time for the special service to commemorate those who died in WWI.

Pauline had a very personal reason for wanting to commemorate those who died as her uncle, Sydney Geering, her father's eldest brother, was amongst those from Hertford who gave up his life in the service of his country. He was not a member of the Hertfordshire Regiment and his name actually appears on the memorial in the

Memorial chapel. A number of other members of the Geering family have been loyal members of All Saints over the last 50 or so years including not only Pauline but also Mary Geering and her husband Les, who was also a brother to Sydney, Sheila Hudson and Margaret Collins and we give thanks for all that they contributed to the life of the church and especially to the Women's Fellowship.
