

Bible come to Life

Exhibition from 1st-4th February at St Paul's Church St Albans



St Paul's Church, St Albans will be hosting an exhibition that brings the Bible to life for people of all ages. The free 'Bible comes to life' exhibition will be at the church over the weekend of Friday February 1st to Monday February 4th.

It features interactive and multi-sensory displays, with large models, fascinating artefacts and talks delivered by experts in Biblical costumes.

Prominent will be a three-metre by twometre model of the Temple in Jerusalem at the time of Jesus, complete with smoking altar!

Other exhibits include a large-scale model of the desert tabernacle where worship took place during the Jewish people's wanderings after their exodus from Egypt.

The exhibition will also feature objects from Jewish life, including Sabbath candlesticks and bread, Jewish prayer shawls, a Passover plate and a collection of Middle Eastern clothing with some items dating back 150 years. Parties from several local schools will be visiting the exhibition at St Paul's.

Exhibition organiser Helen Chilton said:

"It's great that we've been able to host this important exhibition. We want to help local people understand the Jewish roots of the Christian faith, and to see something of the world that Jesus would have known and seen around him.

After coming to the exhibition, we hope visitors will read the Bible with renewed interest. They will have seen and experienced so many important places and objects described in the Old and New Testaments."
