

This 65 minute performance is a result of extensive research into the dark world of state-sanctioned torture and its stark impact on victims, perpetrators, families and those who collude in the 'process'.

Immersive in style, Feeding the Darkness frames verbatim and 'faction' monologues, duologues and poetry as a series of 'ministries' which challenge our ignorance and avoidance of this sensitive and disturbing subject.

It features such wide-ranging material as the experiences of the mother of Private Lynddie England (court-marshalled for her role in the abuse of Abu Ghraib detainees), that of a Kurdish asylum seeker at an appeal tribunal, and the role of trained medical professionals in state-sanctioned torture, amongst many others.

Bells Appeal - Update

Since our appeal was launched, in February, I thought it was time for a brief update on progress to date.

First, there have been several generous personal donations, and I am advised that as at 10 June £3,510 had been banked. This included £500 from Councillor Bob Deering's Locality Fund.

We have also received the promise of grants from two bellringing groups:

The Hertford County Association of Change Ringers have awarded a grant of £2,500, payable when work has been completed; and

The West Anglian Guild has promised a grant of £250, again when work is completed.

A further grant of £1,500 has now been received from the Allchurches Trust, together with sums approaching £1,000 through donations at Basil Jones' funeral.

Basil was a regular ringer at Hertford although he lived in Birch Green and was a member of the band at Hertingfordbury.

Putting all this together suggests we have raised a total of £8,760 so far – just over one-third of our target of £25,000.

Hertford & District Foodbank

In May we fed 165 people – compared with 116 last year - issuing 1629kg of food and receiving 1037kg in donations.

The increase of 40% in clients attending during the month compared to last year is presenting us with the challenge of providing enough core range items to our clients particularly during a period when food donations to us fall off during the summer months. We are having to buy stocks of food items in regularly at the moment.

As reported in our last update this follows on from the increases we experienced at the beginning of the year when there was a 68% increase in January and February. These increases are mainly due to Universal Credit and the closure of the Salvation Army Foodbank in Ware.

ASDA Grant

A Grant for £25,000.00 has been applied for to resource an electric van to transport donations from all the Ware and Hertford supermarkets to the Hertford Store and eventually stocking the planned store in Ware. There are also trips to our Hoddesdon warehouse and sometimes the need to exchange stock with other local Foodbanks.

There will a "Food Drive" at the Ware ASDA store in the week 8 – 13 July.

Out of interest, we have been able to obtain TIN CAN COOK BOOK which will be

a useful resource for our clients.

As you can see we are extremely busy especially keeping up with the demands of working with Trussell Trust and all the expectations that are required on our volunteers. We ask for your prayerful support and for your continued generosity in donating food.
