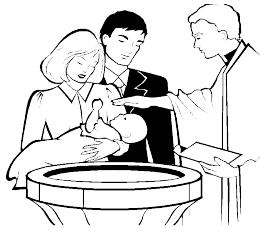

Bishop's Harvest Appeal

Imagine if, when you flicked on a light switch, nothing happened. For many people in Tanzania, where access to electricity is very limited, households cannot continue to run efficiently after dark. Families struggle with everyday chores; children suffer with poor performance and attendance at school; without electricity, basic services – water, health and education – are all hindered.

At present, households depend on paraffinstyle (kerosene) lamps in the evenings, which have led to an increase in the number of serious burns and people needing expensive hospital treatment. Cooking is done over firewood or charcoal, but the high levels of smoke indoors cause people to suffer with frequent respiratory infections.

The Bishop of St Albans' Harvest Appeal 2019, Light Up Tanzania, seeks to make it possible for more than 350 households to have access to cheap, renewable energy in the form of solar panels. Solar panels create clean, renewable energy with zero emissions, which is good for the environment, and can totally transform family life after the sun has gone down.

St Albans Cathedral Space Voyage 28th October to 1st November

This October visitors to St Albans Cathedral will have the chance to travel out of this world, walk amongst the stars and take 'one small step' on the moon. St Albans Cathedral Space Voyage takes place from 28 October to 1 November and will illuminate both the exterior and interior of the Cathedral, immersing visitors of all ages in a dramatic experience of cosmic light and sound.

Produced by Artistic Collaboration *Luxmuralis*, the stunning installation sees the facade of the Cathedral transformed into a visual journey to the edge of the Milky Way and back. The longest nave in England will become an ethereal galaxy as light and music fill the huge, ancient spaces. And a special installation to commemorate the Moon Landing uses NASA imagery of the lunar surface allowing people to walk on the moon and take their very own 'One Small Step'.

The Dean of St Albans Cathedral, the Very Rev'd Dr Jeffrey John, said, "*Cathedrals specialise in awe and transcendence. They were built to remind us that we are small and finite in the universe, yet surrounded by the incomprehensible grandeur of creation. A Cathedral is just the place to contemplate the mysteries of space and the place of human beings within it. This is a spectacular, unmissable experience which will dazzle your eyes and expand your horizons to infinity. Highly recommended for earthlings of every age.*"



Luxmuralis Artistic Director Peter Walker commented, "Art has for millennia been at the centre of humanity's journey, to live and learn and express. That is still the case today, where art allows us to explore and discuss and imagine in new ways. Space Voyage will do just that – a combination of sound and light and artwork that will transform the remarkable infrastructure of St Albans Cathedral in a way that has never been done before, as we take visitors on a journey to the edge of the universe and back."
