Dear friends,

Another month, another newsletter but what can I say that hasn't been said before? And perhaps more to the point, what have I said before!!

Life at All Saints continues as usual, or at least what has become the new usual. We have had some memorable services and a very high standard of preaching from visiting clergy.

In particular, thanks to Rev Selina Evans, we had a very special Easter Day with plenty of: "Alleluia, Christ is risen – He is risen indeed Alleluia."

Despite a number of our regular members being away due to holidays or illness we had a good-sized congregation of over 130 which included 20 children and their parents, as well as a number of other friends old and new. There truly was a sense of celebration and the church was beautifully decorated, thanks to the Flower Club. We had the Easter cross, a lovely Easter Garden which was put together by the children attending the Good Friday Family service and as usual the choir sang beautifully. There were Easter eggs for the children and a number left over for some lucky adults. We are very fortunate to have so many talented people at All Saints as well as so many kind visiting clergy who have not only led our services but then stayed on to meet with us over coffee. They have all told me how much they enjoy coming to us. Hopefully that means that we are, as I truly believe, a welcoming church.

Over the last six months we have been pleased to welcome large numbers of children from local schools into our church, both over the Christmas period and more recently in smaller groups coming to learn more about Christianity as part of the national curriculum. Children have a wonderful way of asking questions that perhaps adults would never ask. One school brought in 30 children each of whom asked a

question about the resurrection. Martin and I welcomed them and tried to answer their questions as best we could, but how do you answer the question. "So how did Jesus rise from the dead?" or even "Did Jesus really come back to life or was it just that lots of people imagined that they had seen him?" Bishop Jane recently told me that when she went into a school and the children were told that they could ask her anything they liked one asked "Do you like McDonalds?"

However, whatever their questions it is clear that the children, even those who never go to church, are interested in the church, what is in it and what the Christian faith means to us. They also visit places of worship for other faiths and really do want to learn more about all religions. We live in a multi-cultural, multilingual society where sometimes fear or discomfort comes about due to an inability to understand another person's beliefs and customs. Surely the best way to overcome negative feelings is to learn more about our brothers and sisters of other faiths just as we hope they want to learn about our faith.

Following our APCM we shared fellowship over a Bring and Share lunch and I realized how good it is to come together over a meal and good conversation. I am hoping to organise another social event in the next couple of months but in the meantime please come along to our Plant GreenWatch talk and lunch on 18th May and then come back on the following day to celebrate Pentecost, to welcome our new Mayor at the Civic Service and enjoy refreshments afterwards in the back of the church.

I pray for you all and for the growth of our faith as we truly encounter our Lord Jesus Christ not only in our worship but in the love that we share with one another and the concern that we share for our world and all those who are suffering at this time.
