Evening Concert

We have recently reached an agreement with UHArts to jointly present a series of evening concerts in All Saints in 2007.

The first concert features prize-winning pianist Richard Uttley on February 24th at 7.30 pm.

Richard's programme will include *Sonatas* by Berg and Beethoven (*Les Adieux*) and Brahms *Four Piano pieces Op 119* as well as more recent works by Adès and Jackson.

Richard is in his second year of reading Music at Clare College, Cambridge and studies piano with Ian Buckle. He previously attended the Junior School of the Royal Northern College of Music and Greenhead College, Huddersfield.

In 2004, Richard reached the National Quarter Finals of the BBC Young Musician of the Year. He was the winner of the Kirklees Young Musician of the Year 2005 prize and in the same year won the Moray Piano Competition.

In October 2006, Richard won the Seventh British Contemporary Piano Competition. This success has secured him many future engagements throughout the country. In addition to taking first prize, Richard won the Sonic Arts Network prize for his performance of a work with tape.
