
Beds and Herts Historic Churches Trust

Heritage Open Day

Sunday 9th September 2007

Heritage Open Days are organised nationally by the Civic Trust and on this day buildings all over the country, not normally open to the public, will be open. Events are organised by local civic and amenity societies.

This year's event in Hertford, organised by Hertford Civic Society, is a focus on St. Andrew's Street, Many of the buildings are listed for reasons of intrinsic quality, timber framing or their group value. The street has evolved over the centuries in response to changes of use and social change. The parish of St. Andrew has existed for over a thousand years. The present church dates from 1870.

There is much to look at both outside and inside the individual buildings and the close co-operation between the Society and the St. Andrew Street Association has resulted in a number of premises being open in the afternoon from 2 - 4.30 so that interiors can be seen and also for some trading. These are: Peter & Susan Brown Interiors, Beckwiths, Cross & Palmer, Hertfordshire Graphics, and Vogue Hairdressers.

Refreshments will be available in St. Andrew's Church and Jean Riddell's exhibition of the street will be on view. We shall have guides, information leaflets and a quiz. The Castle is having an Open Day and to visit both makes an ideal combination.

Street Pastors

Street Pastors, a national project started a few years ago by Rev. Les Isaacs in Clapham, has now become established in a growing number of towns and cities.

The idea is to train Christian volunteers of all ages from different churches to work on the streets at critical times - such as Friday and Saturday evenings - in consultation with the police. By befriending and listening to young people and adults the "pastors" seek to be a positive influence in the community.

Local schemes have recently been started in Bishop's Stortford and Broxbourne and the Hertfordshire Police have now asked the churches in Hertford and Ware to consider a possible project.

Recently the clergy and church leaders met with a representative of Hertford Police and the organiser of the Bishop's Stortford scheme. Having thought about it together, we feel this is something we should consider further. This could be a good follow-on to Hertfest and ongoing opportunity of working together to show Christian care for our community. We see this as complementary to the excellent work already being done by Young Life and Future Hope.

To take this further we are now looking for one or two people who would lead a small steering group to do some important groundwork exploring the vision within our churches, talking with the local police and District Council and contacting the national umbrella organisation and other local schemes. Then, if the idea develops and seems right, the group would start planning an appropriate scheme for this area.
