Friends of Aschiana Child Sponsorship Scheme

A scheme has now been set up so that anyone who wishes to sponsor a child (girl or boy) to go to school at an Aschiana centre in Kabul can do so. You are asked to sponsor for a year in advance, so that your money is not lost in bank fees and charges.

The cost is £130, which provides a child with education, basic health care, training in vocational skills such as tailoring and carpentry – and emotional support.

Etudes Op. 10 - Chopin

If you watched this year's BBC Young Musician of the Year competition, then today's recitalist will be familiar to you. He was the piano winner and performed Rachmaninoff's 'Rhapsody on a Theme of Paganini' in the televised Grand Final.

Erdem started piano lessons when he was nine. He is currently in his first year at Guildhall School of Music and Drama, where he has been awarded a full scholarship.

In 2006, Erdem was awarded 3rd place in the International Rachmaninov Competition for

Young Pianists and was also awarded both the Keyboard Instrument Prize in 2006 and the Principal's prize in 2008 at GSMD. He has enjoyed receiving masterclasses from top pianists David Dolan, Ronan O'Hora, Bernard Roberts, Peter Donohoe and Jeremy Menuhin and has performed in venues including St Martin in the Fields, Snape Maltings, The Wigmore Hall and Cardiff Millennium Centre as well as abroad in Poland, France and Russia.

Wednesday 10th December Michael Frith - Organ

If you have seen this year's Proms prospectus, you could hardly have missed the fact that 2008 is the centenary of the birth of Olivier Messiaen. Not only at the Proms, but all over the world there have been special celebratory festivals and performances of his music.

Many composers suffer a decline in their reputations in the years following their death, but not Messiaen; since his death in 1992 his standing has increased and he is now generally recognised as one of the greatest composers of the twentieth century. He composed in virtually all musical forms including, belatedly, opera, but his contribution to organ music is unquestionably the most significant and original since Bach's.

December 10th is the actual centenary day, and Soundbites will be celebrating the event with a performance of Messiaen's famous Christmas work 'La Nativité du Seigneur', one of his earliest masterworks and most frequently performed.

This is colourful and dramatic music with instant appeal. Among its nine movements there are portraits of some of the characters of the story – Virgin and Child, Shepherds, Angels, Wise Men - and quiet, mystical meditations on some of the ideas associated with Christmas; and there's a sensational toccata in the true French tradition to round it off in a blaze of glory.
