# The Sounds of Silence

Not the well known Simon and Garfunkel song, but the sound coming from the tower before most of the Christmas Services.

So why was this? Well, part of the explanation is that it was not possible to ring for midnight Eucharist at both St Andrews and All Saints on Christmas Eve – the start time of these services was separated by just 15 minutes, which is simply not enough time to close one belfry, cross town, and climb another set of stairs.

But just a few years ago on 1 January 2000 when all towers in the country were encouraged to ring at 12 noon, we managed to ring at both churches simultaneously.

On that occasion we were able to muster a total of 13 ringers. Since that date one of our ringers has died and six others have moved away and/or given up ringing, while just one additional ringer has joined the band. Of the seven, three were away for Christmas visiting their families, leaving just four ringers in Hertford over the Christmas period. Not all four were available on Christmas morning, so that the only Christmas ringing was for the Midnight Eucharist at St Andrews, although we would have liked to have done more.

So what can be done? As I write, another traditional pastime, Morris-dancing is in the spotlight with a similar problem – lack of recruits, most particularly young recruits. Certainly when the youngest person in the tower is in her 40s, we do have to be concerned for the future of bell ringing in Hertford.

However the purpose of this article is not simply to recruit more ringers (although this would be welcome), but rather to ask for help. If anyone has undertaken a similar sort of recruitment drive and been successful, we would like them to tell us what they did and how they did it.

We can hopefully take things from there and avoid having any more churches in Hertford like St Mary, Hertingfordbury where there is no local band to ring on Sundays.

#### Church maintenance

Our eight regular volunteers did about 108 hours during this year, which was very generous, and they managed to carry out some essential works such as the removal of yew berry seeds from the gutters, together with the cleaning out of the road gullies and blocked rainwater hoppers. One on the south side had a bird's nest! There is still one to do on the north side.

As usual we also removed, cleaned and reset wood blocks within the church. One major benefit of the work party was the fact we discovered that the lead had been removed from the south porch before we had had too much rain! This year we have spent a lot of time and effort on St. John's Hall and the Annex, including repairs due to vandalism

We shall have many similar jobs for this next year, together with other jobs we have not yet had the time or labour to start. These include some re-pointing of stonework, repairs to lead flashing, treatment of the oak doors.

It is fairly easy for me to find the work and make notes. What is not easy is to find the workers to do these tasks. Next year will find us short of volunteers due to other commitments so, I am asking that some new people come forward to give a few hours to All Saints, not only because it helps the church but it also becomes quite a social event particularly if I remember to take along the tea and biscuits!

We usually meet once a month (normally the third week) on a Saturday, any time between 9am and 12.30pm. You do not need special skills for much of these works and so long as you can stand up, we can usually find a job to suit everybody.

Dates and times are always noted on the boards in the back of the church and in the Vestry so keep an eye open and, at the same time, please contact me so that I can include you on the list of helpers and notify you personally at the time.
