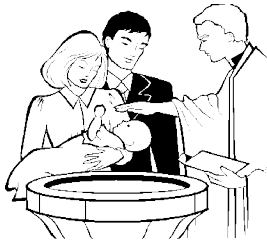

The year passes and the great Festivals of the Church follow on.

At this time of year comes All Souls' Day when we remember our dear ones that we have loved and lost awhile. There is comfort in the thought 'Lost awhile' – that at the end of our earthly pilgrimage we shall be reunited with those we have loved.

Meanwhile we must carry the cross, as did Simon of Cyrene when he bore on his shoulder the cross on which our Lord was to be crucified.
