My own view from the pew during June has been somewhat different as we have been away on holiday for two weeks. In fact whilst on holiday we only managed to attend one Sunday service as we spent the second Sunday travelling through France. However on both Sundays I could draw comparisons with the ministry of our Lord Jesus as the first church was right on the edge of a lake (admittedly it was Lake Como in Italy rather than Galilee!) and then our journey on the second Sunday took us through the French vineyards of Burgundy and Champagne. There we were constantly aware of just how much work goes into caring for the vines and just how difficult it is to cope with the vagaries of the weather which can drastically affect the production of the world famous wines.

The church on Lake Como was somewhat smaller than All Saints but very ornate and welcoming. The congregation of English speaking residents and holiday makers enjoyed the very same liturgy and readings which were being used here and, although there was only an organist and no choir, the congregation did their best to sing the hymns with enthusiasm and joy in our Risen Lord.

The priest and his wife, whose home is in Perth, Australia, were spending five months of their retirement ministering to the small English speaking community around Lake Como. My most enduring memory of the whole service was when, during his sermon, the priest described the Holy Spirit as being like dynamite! Rather than the all-pervasive wind which has often been my perception of the Holy Spirit, the idea of an explosive and earth shattering presence, which

affects everything around it and is impossible to ignore, was a real eye opener and I haven't been able to stop thinking about it ever since.

Being by a lake gave us several excuses to take boat trips and, just as our Lord escaped from the pressures of everyday life by going out on a boat to get away from the crowds, so we were able to enjoy a time of peace and relaxation away from the usual responsibilities of our normal life here in Hertford

Whilst we were away we were so sad to hear of the death of Colin, husband of our wonderful curate Ginni. We gave thanks for the fact that he was able to be present at her amazingly special ordination service, held here in All Saints in May. We hope that she and all Colin's family will gain comfort from the love of God and the love of the family of All Saints, Hertford.
