The Mustard Seed

Dear Friends.

This week we reflect on the "mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade."

Jesus' images of the kingdom are alive and organic. This mustard seed has its own pattern of growth, a tiny plant that grows into a massive tree with room for every creature. It reminds us that we should never imagine that we are the architects or builders of God's kingdom. It is enough for us to be part of planting the seed, be caring and patient, the seed will grow animated by God's Spirit.

Simple things we say or do can have a big influence. One person can affect many, even without knowing it. The kingdom of God grows of its own impetus in the world, and nobody

can stop it, like good seed growing underground. God is the God of here, there and everywhere. Seeds may sprout anywhere in the field, and the kingdom can find its way into the lives of individuals and communities in ways that may be surprising. The mustard seed becomes a tree for all; the kingdom of God is for every man, woman and child. Can we bring something of the kingdom of God – of love and peace, prayer and faith, justice and hope? We may not see it or recognise it, but let's fill our minds and hearts with gratitude as we pray.

Creator God, we think about seeds, imagine holding them in our hands and seeing their smallness, weakness, insignificance.

Yet you see potential, growth, significance. Tiny seeds grow by your power into amazing plants and trees.

They provide food for the hungry and homes for your creatures.

From the darkness of the earth springs forth your life, your harvest.

Your Kingdom is like a tiny seed.

When we look at your church, and our own lives,

We may see smallness, weakness, insignificance. yet you see potential, growth, significance.

Give us eyes of faith and willing hands to see your Kingdom grow in us.

May we reflect on our faith, stewardship and welcome, may we reflect on what it is to be your family

and plant the seeds and gather the harvest your love has provided.

In Jesus' name and the power of the Spirit we commit our lives to you again.

Amen.
