Pilgrim Places, Holy Lives



This summer, the Church of England offers a new reflection campaign centred around pilgrimage – places and stories that help us feel part of something bigger on our journey towards God.

Each of us has our own story, but we are also part of bigger stories. The greatest story ever told is that of God becoming human in Jesus to offer us a transforming relationship with him. Through these reflections, we will see how this amazing story took root in Anglo-Saxon England, and how those who responded to it became signposts to God. They not only changed the world around them but can still challenge, inspire, and encourage us today.

Running from the day after Pentecost (25 May) to 21 June, these readings and reflections explore eight places which were important in the spread of Christianity in England, and the stories of the saints who lived there. Each day will include a Bible reading, a prayer, a short reflection and a suggested action or reflective question.

Week 1 - Welcoming the gospel
Week 2 - Living for the gospel
Week 3 - Trusting in the gospel
Week 4 - Light of the gospel

St Albans Diocesan Pilgrimages

A Christian pilgrimage is a journey to a place of special spiritual meaning, which can be

travelled alone or in the company of others. It is an outward sign of an inward spiritual journey, one that can include reflection and prayer.

Pilgrimage offers a shared, embodied way of deepening faith that reflects the Diocese's vision of going deeper with God, making new disciples and transforming communities. Walking together in prayer – whether on large, well-established journeys or quieter, smaller pilgrimages organised by parishes and individuals – helps people to connect worship with everyday life and the landscape around them.

These journeys create space for reflection, storytelling and fellowship, drawing on the rich heritage of the Diocese while remaining accessible to people at many stages of faith.

Environmental Activities at All Saints

All Saints has several events coming up, in line with caring for the environment.

The first is Churches Count on Nature which is part of Love Your Burial Ground Week and runs from the 6th to the 14th of June. The focus is on the brilliant wildlife to be found in churchyards and chapel yards and is a joint initiative promoted by Caring for God's Acre, the Church of England, the Church in Wales and A Rocha UK.



During the week of Churches Count on Nature, we are asked to record all the wildlife

- both fauna and flora - that is found in our churchyard. We have invited experts to survey and record different aspects of the environment but would very much like to involve members of our own congregation too. If anyone is willing to come into the churchyard during that week and record what there is, particularly in plant life, please chat to Fiona or Nerine.

We are inviting all those who have been involved to join us for tea at 3:00 on the afternoon of Sunday 14 June when we can share what has been identified.

Secondly, on July 18 we are holding a Green Watch Activity Day when we plan to have many stations around the churchyard with activities for families, helping children to become more engaged with wildlife. We have support from Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust, and a few other organisations, but if anyone from All Saints is willing to man a stall with an activity or help with refreshments, we would be very grateful.

The annual Environment Day comes up on September 12, the same day as the Bike 'n Hike. More detail on that to follow!

Singing Saints

We have been working for some months on a plan to start a children's choir (primary school age junior choir) at All Saints. This will be a weekly choir for children age 7+ on Fridays, after school, during term time.

The purpose of this is to bring in the next generation of choristers for All Saints, acting as a feed into the main choir. By encouraging singing at primary school level, we hope to imbue children with a love of singing, specifically in terms of church music, and to develop their singing potential and association with All Saints.

It will also act as another gathering point for children and families in the church and aim to encourage participation of those families at services and within the general life of the church.

Once children are established and doing well in the children's choir, we will be aiming for them to move up into the main choir as choristers at the end of primary school/start of secondary school, unless they show early potential and a desire to move up earlier than this.

We will start this in a gentle way later in June, with a view to a formal launch and much publicity late August/early September

Kate Macpherson ARCO, All Saints parishioner and former Assistant Organist at Waltham Abbey and Christ Church Southgate, will be running Singing Saints, with support from the music department.

We are pleased to say that Rachel Chaplin (Hertford Children's Choir) is actively helping us in doing this.

Since completing his studies, Adrian has embarked on an international career, performing in numerous countries such as Russia, Germany, Austria, Madeira and Italy. Known for his intelligent and expressive readings of Romantic repertoire, he presents a lunchtime recital that balances poetry, drama, and structural clarity.

At the age of eight, Ugnė Liepa Žuklytė was the winner of the Balyš Dvarionas Competition, awarded a special prize for musical interpretation, and made her solo debut with orchestra. She studied at the Royal College of Music. British pianist Archie Bonham is the Adam Fellow in Collaborative Piano at the Royal College of Music. In 2014 he was a Fellow at the Aspen Music Festival and School in Colorado, and a Britten Pears and Shipston Song Young Artist.

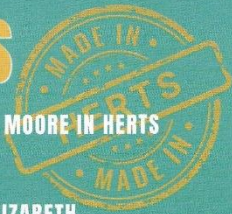




